Kasim Reed is the 59th Mayor of the City of Atlanta. He served with a 20-year tenure for three terms. Mayor Reed has increased the city's size and reduced the City's spending during the worst recession in 80 years. In his 10 years in office, he has hired more than 900 police officers and created the largest police force in the City's history. He opened all of the City's recreation centers as a Mayor for young people and improved the economic response times. Mayor Reed has received numerous accolades since taking office.

In 2013, he was ranked among the top 10 most influential African Americans in the nation by the *West* publication of the Washington Post Company.



Miguel Southwell was named general manager for the world's busiest airport in May 2014, bringing more than two decades of aviation management experience to the post. He is leading the Terminal 5 construction project in executing a Master Plan that will guide the Airport's development for the next 25 years, solidifying its position as Georgia's chief economic development tool.

Furthermore, Mr. Southwell has set a list of priorities that include expanding air cargo capacity, cultivating the guest experience and several other initiatives all aimed at increasing the global economic impact and making it an ever larger force in the global aviation market.



Glen Welling serves as the USO Vice President of Operations. Mr. Welling was appointed to this position in 2013. He manages the USO's daily operations, volunteer Services and Facilities & Logistics for more than 25 years. Mr. Welling holds leadership positions in the military, academia and both the private and not-for-profit sectors, including serving as Executive Director of the Yellow Ribbon Bar organization Program. This initiative was established by Congress to support National Guard and Reserve members and their families by providing them with information, services, referrals and proactive outreach support in their transition to the civilian workforce.
